

Hallwas to Discuss Carnegie's Philanthropy



Noted local commentator and author John Hallwas will be the speaker at the FOMPL annual dinner on Thursday, April 18. Hallwas' presentation will be on Andrew Carnegie's public library philanthropy and American values. The Macomb Public Library is a Carnegie Library having been built over a hundred years ago in 1904. His talk coincides with the ongoing "Campaign for the Future" to raise funds for the remodeling and expansion of the library.

A writer, speaker, and adult-education leader, Hallwas is a Distinguished Professor Emeritus at

Western Illinois University who is well-known for his many books

about Illinois and the Midwest. He has written scores of journal articles and hundreds of newspaper and magazine essays, as well as several plays. He is the recipient of more than two dozen awards for his teaching, scholarship, books, and educational service.

The Hallwas presentation will follow the Friends annual meeting and dinner and is scheduled for 7 p.m. The public is invited. Don't miss this presentation by the most widely published author in Western Illinois University's history.

The Campaign for the Future Forges Ahead

The Campaign for the Future continues to collect donations from the public. organizations and businesses in the Macomb area. We have just completed a letter writing campaign and have realized \$16.350 from individuals and \$17,475 from business and organizations. The Campaign is reaching the \$600,000 mark with deadline to reach our goal of \$794,000 June 30. 2013. The Campaign Committee has several projects in the works for April and May: a Children's' Auction, Adult Auction with a dance, benefit music concert, plus a couple other surprises. The library will continue to solicit donations from individuals, businesses, and organizations to reach our goal and received \$2.4 million dollars in Build Illinois funds for the remodel. Twenty years ago the Friends of the Macomb Public Library was created, and at the time, I was a member of the Board of Trustees of the library (what we in the Friends group call the "Big Board"). I remember that the library board had lengthy discussions about the wisdom of having a Friends group at all. We were concerned about what role the organization would have, what potential problems might arise, how the library staff would interact with volunteers. With the benefit of hindsight, we can easily see how misguided our concerns were. Over these past twenty years, the Friends organization has raised thousands of dollars that have been directly invested in enriching and enhancing the Library. Our Friends have organized and administrated book clubs, have provided reading materials to nursing homes and travelers, have financed the Summer Reading program for children, have sponsored literary programming, have beautified the library both inside and outside. While every one of our Friends members may not be actively involved in all of these activities, we are all library advocates who stand up for and support the library and its role as a community resource center. During National Library Week (April 14-20, 2013), let us all applaud those pioneer members of our Friends group who established our organization, the generations of members who have participated in boosting the library, and the current men, women, and families who work so hard to supplement the library budget and to complement its mission.
