Jefferson St. The event will start with a preview sale – the Members Only Half Price Sale – on Thursday June 25. (See the box below for details.) Membership levels start at \$10, and forms for joining will be available at the preview sale. The sale will end with a bag sale from 3 to 4 pm on Saturday June 27. Please join us and promote our event as it is our most successful fund raiser for the Macomb Public Library.

Speaker Larry Balsamo Featured at FOMPL 22nd Annual Meeting

Approximately 55 people attended the Friends of the Macomb Public Library (FOMPL) Annual Dinner April 16 at the Macomb Country Club. A social hour was followed by a brief business meeting. President Paula Wise called the meeting to order and introduced the current FOMPL Board Members, the Macomb Public Library Board members, and Director of the Library Dennis Danowski.

Danowski gave an update on the status of the current library construction with the goal of hosting a "soft opening" during Heritage Days this year. Wise recognized the benefactors and indicated we currently have 139 memberships. Appreciation was expressed for the continued membership support; for Karen Proulx, the editor of our newsletter; and for the book sales core crew of Sam and Becky Parker, Elisa Rasmussen, Phil and Margene Weiss, and Karen Proulx. President Wise's annual report highlighted some of our activities during the year noting the book sales took in more than \$10,000 for the 8th year in a row. Our largest expenditure was a \$15,000 contribution towards the purchase of the empty

lot next to the Library Annex. This year we also supported the YMCA Little Free Library effort, continued with our two book clubs, provided weekly reviews of books in the Voice, kept stocking our free books at the train station, donated paperbacks to the county jail, gave gifts to the Library staff, and supported the year round programing for the children's library including the very popular summer reading program. Most recently, we have started giving away books in a plastic, covered tub in front of the Library Annex.

Under new business, the slate for nominees to the board through 2017 was approved unanimously. Members who were renewed were Laura Egler, Kate Joswick, Becky Parker. Karen Proulx, and Paula Wise.

After the business meeting and dinner approximately 25 additional people joined the group for the 7 p.m. program by Dr. Larry Balsamo "The Impact of the Civil War 150 Years Later."
